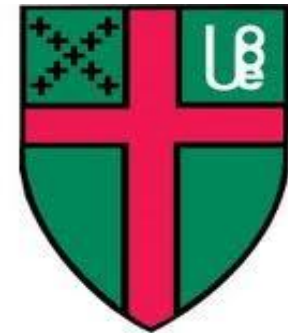
Meeting Schedule

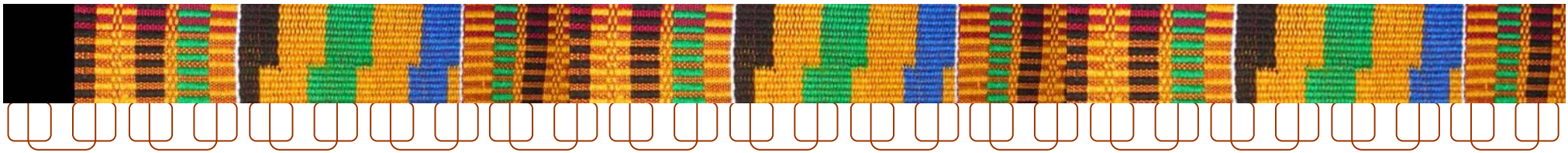

A Brief History of UBE

The Union of Black Episcopalians stands in the continuing tradition of more than 200 years of Black leadership in the Episcopal Church. Beginning with the Rev. Absalom Jones, the first priest of African descent and the establishment of St. Thomas African Episcopal Church in Philadelphia in 1794, the leadership of Blacks in the Episcopal Church has continued through UBE chapters across the United States, Caribbean, and Africa.

Organized in 1968 as the Union of Black Clergy and Laity, the Union is the proud inheritor of the work of many people like Suffragan Bishop the Rt. Rev. Quintin E. Primo, Jr.; Bishop of Washington, D.C. the Rt. Rev. John T. Walker; consultant to the Presiding Bishop the Rev. Tollie L. Caution, and the first elected lay president of UBE, Deborah Harmon Hines, Ph.D. UBE also grew out of the work and spirit of earlier organizations. The convocation of the Colored Clergy and the Conference of ministry of Blacks in the Episcopal Church.

The Maryland Chapter of UBE was established in 1989 with the Rev. Eddie M. Blue as the first president. The chapter continues to be dedicated to serve an instrument to eradicate racism and injustice as Episcopalians encounter Christ and engage the world.
